## Virginia Chamber Orchestra Lands International Maestro

### Maestro David Grandis to Conduct Fall Concert: "Romantics with a French Twist"

The Virginia Chamber Orchestra (VCO) is honored to announce that Maestro David Grandis will take the podium as the orchestra's new Music Director on Sunday, October 20<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 in the afternoon at the Ernst Community Cultural Center on the Annandale campus of the Northern Virginia Community College. The program, "Romantics with a French Twist," will include music by Schubert, Wagner, and the French composer Poulenc.

Highly recommended by departing Music Director Emil de Cou, Grandis is one of the most accomplished young conductors now appearing on both sides of the Atlantic. When in Europe, he regularly serves as Assistant Conductor of the historic Lyon National Opera. In the U.S., he is currently assuming his new position as conductor of the College of William and Mary Symphony Orchestra in addition to his new role with the VCO.

Grandis' guest conducting appearances include the Bordeaux National Symphony and Nice

Philharmonic in France, the Minsk Philharmonic Orchestra (Belarus), and the New Symphony Orchestra of Sofia (Bulgaria). He has also worked with the Baltimore Symphony, Baltimore Opera, and National Philharmonic Orchestra.

David Grandis first appeared as guest conductor with the Virginia Chamber Orchestra in 2011 at the National Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C. He follows a distinguished line of VCO conductors with the unique ability to lead and inspire an ensemble of outstanding professional musicians, as well as to bring classical music to new audiences.

VCO President Douglas Lovejoy echoes this sentiment: "We are grateful to Emil de Cou for introducing us to David. He is an exciting young talent who immediately delighted our audiences and our musicians." Grandis responded: "I am thrilled at the opportunity to lead the gifted musicians of the Virginia Chamber Orchestra, so that we may bring joy and inspiration to Northern Virginia and D.C. audiences. My past collaborations with this talented group of artists have brought me tremendous musical satisfaction, and I look forward to the upcoming season."

In the words of Marco Guidarni, Director of the Nice Philharmonic, David Grandis is "a refined musician of profound artistic sensitivity and a rare intellectual and musical integrity."

For the opening concert of the VCO's 43rd Season David Grandis has selected Schubert's joyful Symphony No. 5 in B flat major, Wagner's *Siegfried Idyll*—a symphonic poem for chamber orchestra—and Poulenc's *Deux marches et un intermède*. 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### **About David Grandis**

Maestro Grandis studied in several national conservatories in France and began his conducting apprenticeship with Klaus Weise. After receiving a B.M. in Musicology in France, he completed a M.M. in orchestral conducting at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign with Donald Schleicher and a G.P.D. at the Peabody Conservatory with Gustav Meier and Markand Thakar.
